



Sheffield Hallam Partnership Bursary 2017/18

CONTINUING STUDENTS PRE 2013

Introduction

The Sheffield Hallam Partnership Bursary is to encourage students from areas where it may be less common for people to go to university

Are you eligible to apply?

- You must be an eligible student on a full time undergraduate degree course and you must have UK or 'home' status
- You must have joined Sheffield Hallam University (SHU) from a partner school or college.
- You can check to see if the school or college you attended are/were part of the agreement in the year you started your study at University.
 - <u>2008</u>
 - 2009
 - <u>2010</u>
 - 2011
 - 2012

Please note: only students who started their course between 2008 and 2012 will be eligible for the bursary as a returning student. If you started your course in 2013, the bursary was only payable in your first year of study.

- If you are a continuing student and started your course in the above years paying full fees of £3,465 or £9,000 you will receive £300 per year.
- You may normally take up to a maximum of one academic year out before progressing to Sheffield Hallam University and remain entitled to the Sheffield Hallam Partnership bursary
- If you defer entry to the University you will be eligible for the bursaries that apply to your year of entry, not the bursaries that applied at the time of your application
- You can use this bursary for any aspect of course-related costs and **you will NOT** have to repay this money
- In order to receive a bursary you must normally have been actively or continuously enrolled at the University from the start of the academic year to the bursary payment date
- Partnership bursaries are paid for each taught year of study. You have until 31st July 2018 to claim your bursary. Bursary payments are not paid retrospectively after this date.

How can you apply?	You do not need to apply for this bursary - we will write to you to inform you in either January or February 2018 and we will pay you during w/c 19th February 2018. If you believe you are entitled to a bursary but have not heard anything by March 2018 you will need to contact Student Funding and Money Skills. Even if you are not applying for any financial assistance from <u>Student Finance England*</u> , you still need to complete certain sections (personal details, bank details, course, university) on the student funding application form.
	* depending on where you live, this may be Student Finance Wales, Student Finance Northern Ireland or SAAS
Application Closing Date	Any bursaries which are scheduled to be paid in the 2017/18 academic year must be paid by the end of the 2017/18 academic year, i.e. 31st July 2018. We will be unable to make any retrospective payments.
