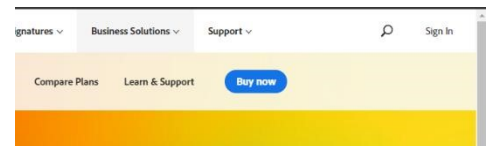

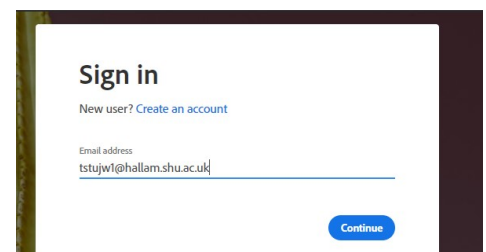
At the top of the web page click on Sign in

- You will then be taken to a SHU Sign in page enter your email address in the following format username@hallam.shu.ac.uk. Enter your password and click on Sign In.

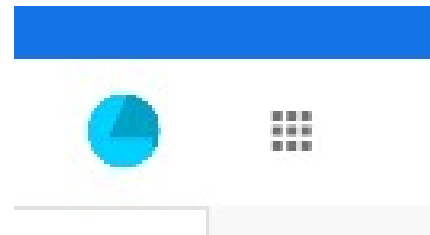

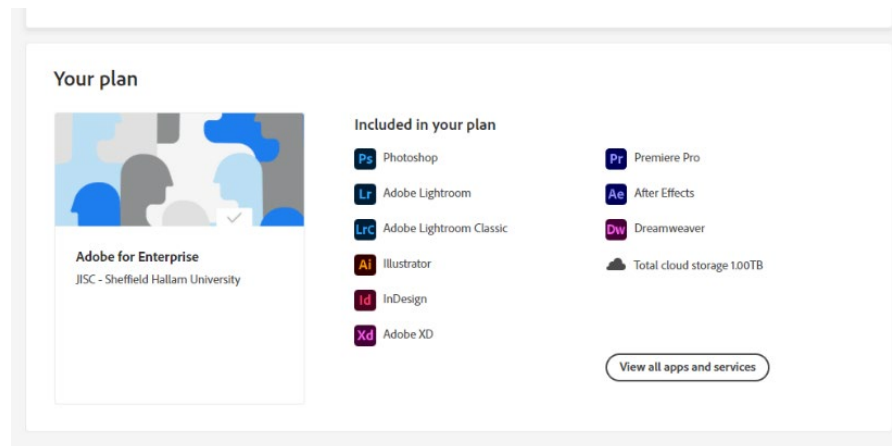

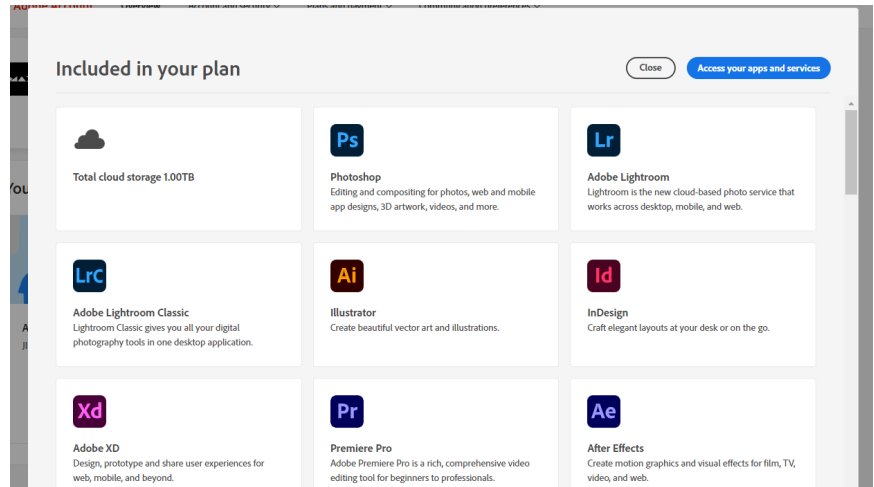

5. A pop up will appear.

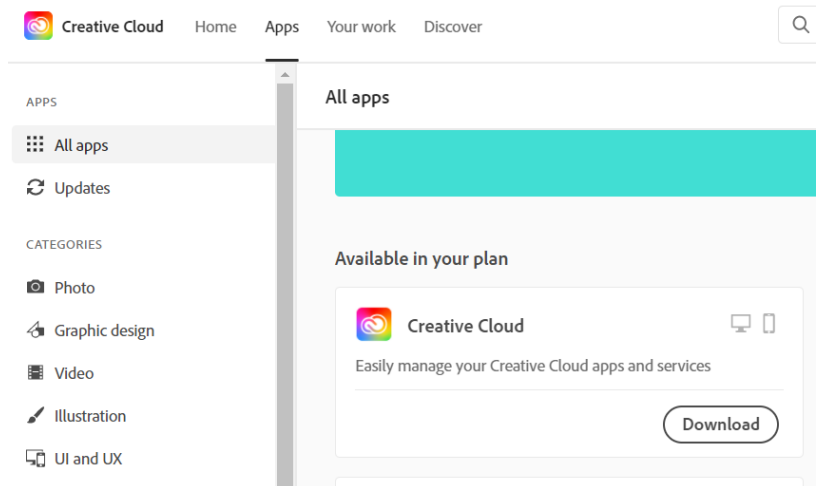
Click on Access your apps and services button

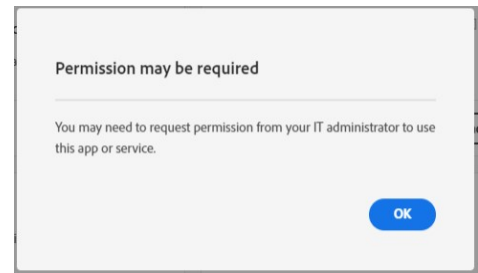

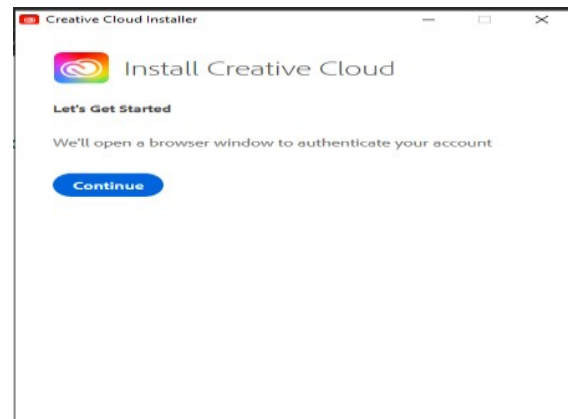

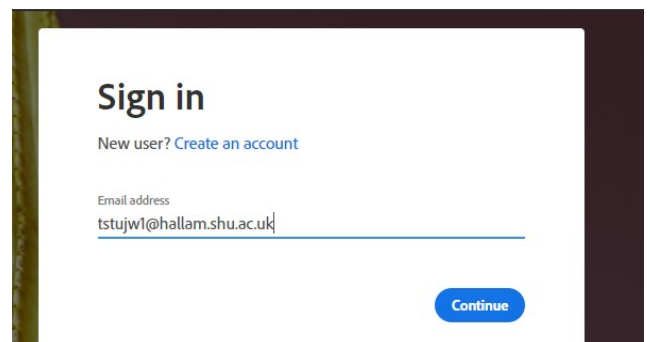
- When you click on Download you will be presented with the following message. You need Admin privileges to install any Adobe software on the computer you are using

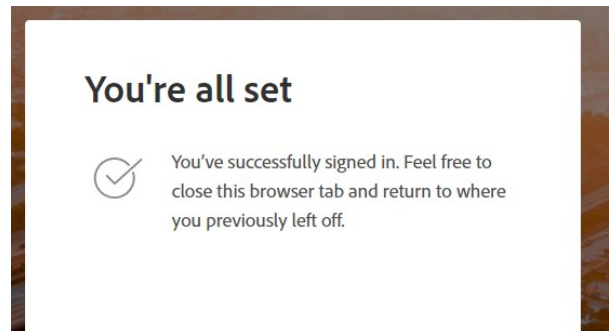

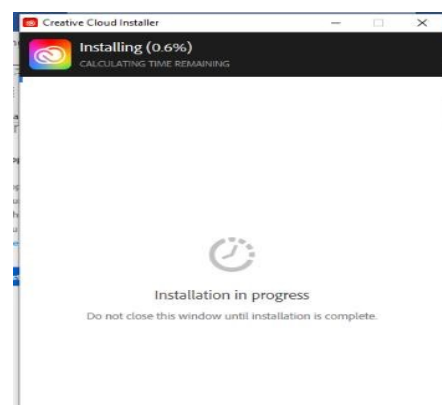
10. Once you have successfully verified your sign in, you will see the following message in your web browser

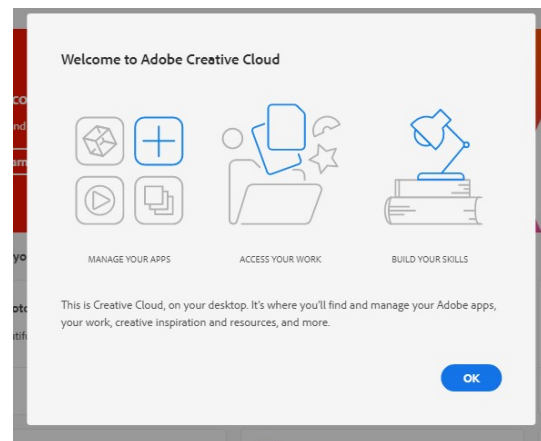

How to stop Adobe Creative Cloud Applications from auto updating on a Personal Device

This installation process may vary for each operating system.

These instructions are for students who have a Home Use Adobe Plan only.

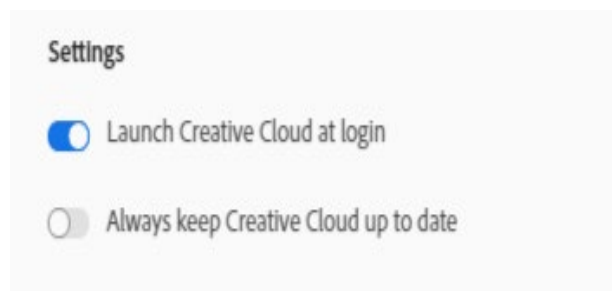
1. Open the Creative Cloud Desktop (CCD) Application by going to the start menu

Go to the file Menu

Click on preferences

2. Click on **General** from the list of tabs on the left and a Settings box will be available.

3. Change the toggle settings for 'Always Keep Creative Cloud Up to Date' to off - so it looks like the image below.



4. Go to the **Apps** tab on the left-hand menu.

The versions of Adobe Creative Cloud Apps you install need to be as close to the versions that are installed on campus as possible. This is so your files can be used both off site and on site in the University labs but also ensures the academic staff

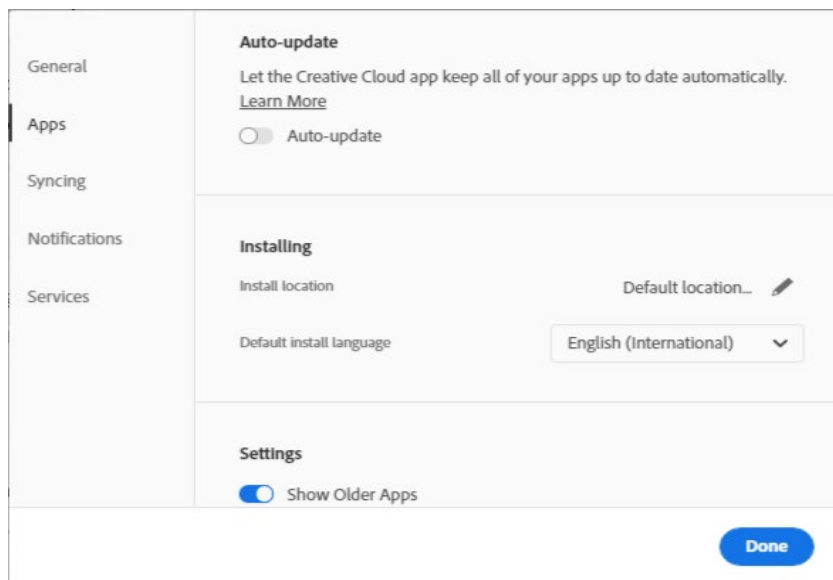

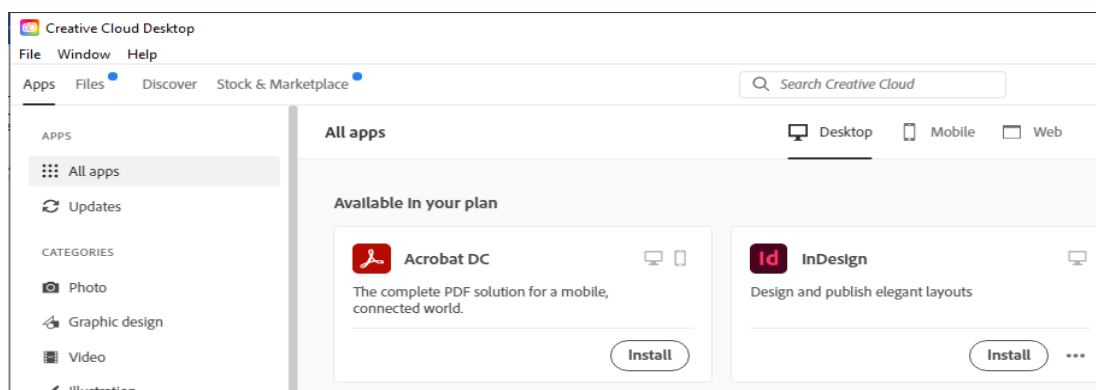

1. Open the Creative Cloud Desktop Application

Click on the Apps menu and select All Apps from the left-hand menu

Scroll down until you see Available in your plan.



2. From the list of Applications pick the Application you want to install (e.g. InDesign in the example above).

Click on the three little dots next to the install button

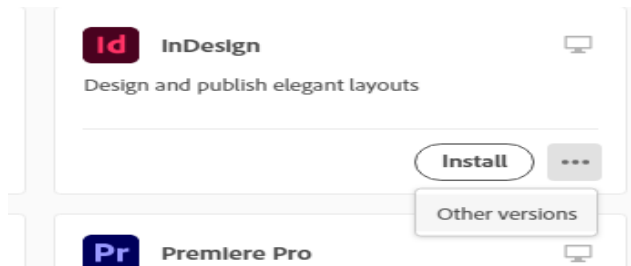

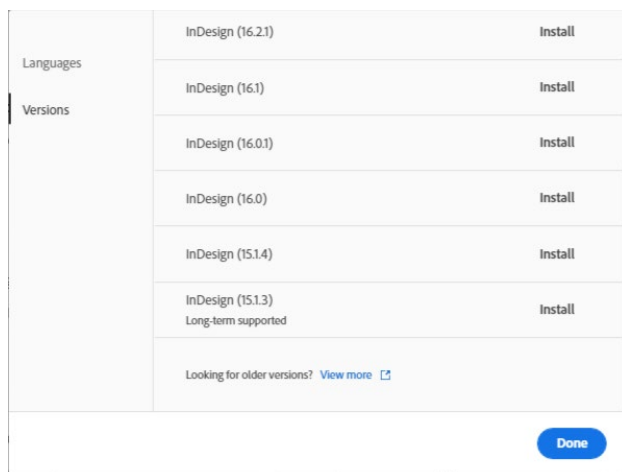

4. Identify the version of the application you need to install to be compatible with the version used on the University Campus.

This will probably be the closest available version to the one still in use on site or the Long term supported (LTS) version.

Please note the version numbers are different between Mac and Windows.
