1 MODULE AIMS

- 4. To demonstrate your ability to summarise and organise information from written or aural sources in the target language or in English, as well as to present it orally.

3 INDICATIVE LEARNING, TEACHING AND ASSESSMENT ACTIVITIES

This module will use a range of learning, teaching and assessment methods. In order to achieve the required learning outcomes, you will need to take part in regular class sessions with the tutor, as well as to engage actively in structured self-directed learning outside the classroom. The learning activities will include the following: pair, group and individual work; preparatory reading and research using paper-based and online sources; preparing and giving oral presentations; language work using written and aural sources; constructing coherent arguments and discussing and expressing opinions on topic-related issues.

During this module you will be provided with oral and written feedback. You will be expected to act on this feedback to progress satisfactorily.

In addition to the weekly session with the tutor, you will also need to attend a weekly one-hour session with the language assistant. During these sessions you will have the opportunity to practise your language skills with a native speaker and to acquire first-hand knowledge of the society, culture and institutions of the target language country. This is important preparation for when you start your study and work placements.

The normal mode of classroom communication will be the target language in order to maximise the opportunities for improving your linguistic competence.

Assessment will take the form of practical and an end of semester examination.
